You said that because an authority thinks something, it must therefore be true.

It's important to note that this fallacy should not be used **to dismiss the claims of experts, or scientific consensus**. Appeals to authority are not valid arguments, but nor is it reasonable to disregard the claims of experts who have a demonstrated depth of knowledge unless one has a similar level of understanding and/or access to empirical evidence. However, it is entirely possible that the opinion of a person or institution of authority is wrong; therefore the authority that such a person or institution holds does not have any intrinsic bearing upon whether their claims are true or not.

Example: Not able to defend his position that evolution 'isn't true' Bob says that he knows a scientist who also questions evolution (and presumably isn't a primate).

Just so I am not putting words in your mouth, can you please clarify whether you are claiming that Terpsehore Maras and VD Hanson are "experts"?

If yes, since Terpsehore Maras is not shy about her association with Qanon, why would pointing out her self-described association be an "appeal to authority"? Isn't she her own authority?

And, since VD Hanson is also explicit in his Anti-Diversity POV, isn't he also his own authority on that matter?

Why do you consider revealing these facts to be "propaganda", and not, in fact, simply citing sources and facts?

Could you please just answer the question about whether you believe POHOA should use Qanon as an EXPERT SOURCE? It is a yes/no question.

American journalist Arthur Stern called "Facing Facts About Race" an "inflammatory" column based upon crime statistics that Hanson never cited, writing: "His presentation of this controversial opinion as undeniable fact without exhaustive statistical proof is undeniably racist."

Anglo-American journalist Kelefa Sanneh, in response to "Facing Facts About Race", wrote "It's strange, then, to read Hanson writing as if the fear of violent crime were mainly a "white or Asian" problem, about which African-Americans might be uninformed, or unconcerned – as if African-American parents weren't already giving their children more detailed and nuanced versions of Hanson's "sermon", sharing his earnest and absurd hope that the right words might keep trouble at bay."

The last reference also brings up the subject of Travon Martin, who was killed by George Zimmerman who was acting on behalf of an HOA's neighborhood watchdog group. The Association was successfully sued by the Martin family because the HOA claimed that their racist approach to safety was justified by logic used by the author you are recommending.

The question for the HOA where this incident occurred tried to justify an inherently racist policy because they said it created Safety and Security for the other homeowners - by targeting people based upon their race or appearance. Your author advocates the same approach, and tries to hide the racism with a reference to statistics he never actually did provide.

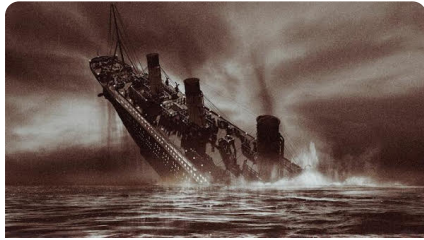

The judge also found that Maras had raised the funds while "misrepresenting education and experience that she did not possess."

Attorneys for North Dakota in the case said that Maras falsely claimed to be a medical doctor and to have both a PhD and an MBA."

I think that if you know this background about your source, which demonstrates she is a fraud, grifter, and is willing to fabricate information to a Court, that source should be dismissed as unworthy of consideration. If you are seriously suggesting that based upon information from this source, we should follow financial investment advice based upon this source, it raises serious questions about your judgement.

Central Bank purchases are now and continuing at record levels in contrast to being net sellers during the earlier period you reference.

Also money laundering has been severely impacted by the Ukraine war which was the lifeblood for some European banks particularly Credit Suisse. So the US had to start providing cash to Ukraine to replace those funds of which the omnibus 1.7 trillion bill has a large part to replace such money laundering for narcotics, child trafficking, etc. to keep the European banks alive.
